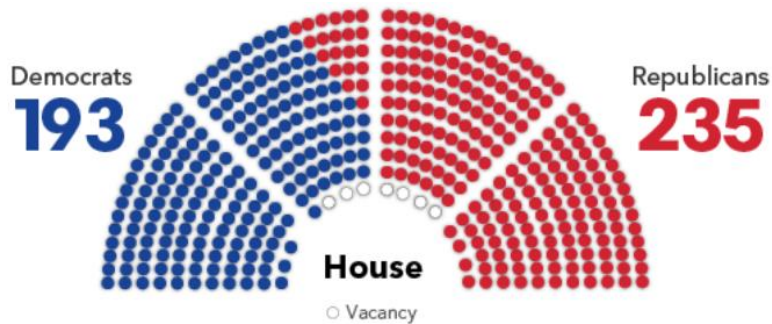

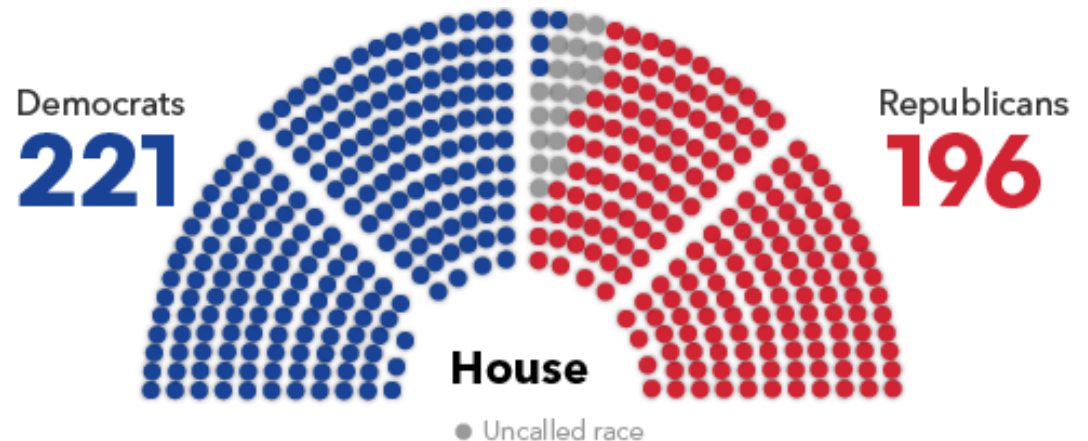

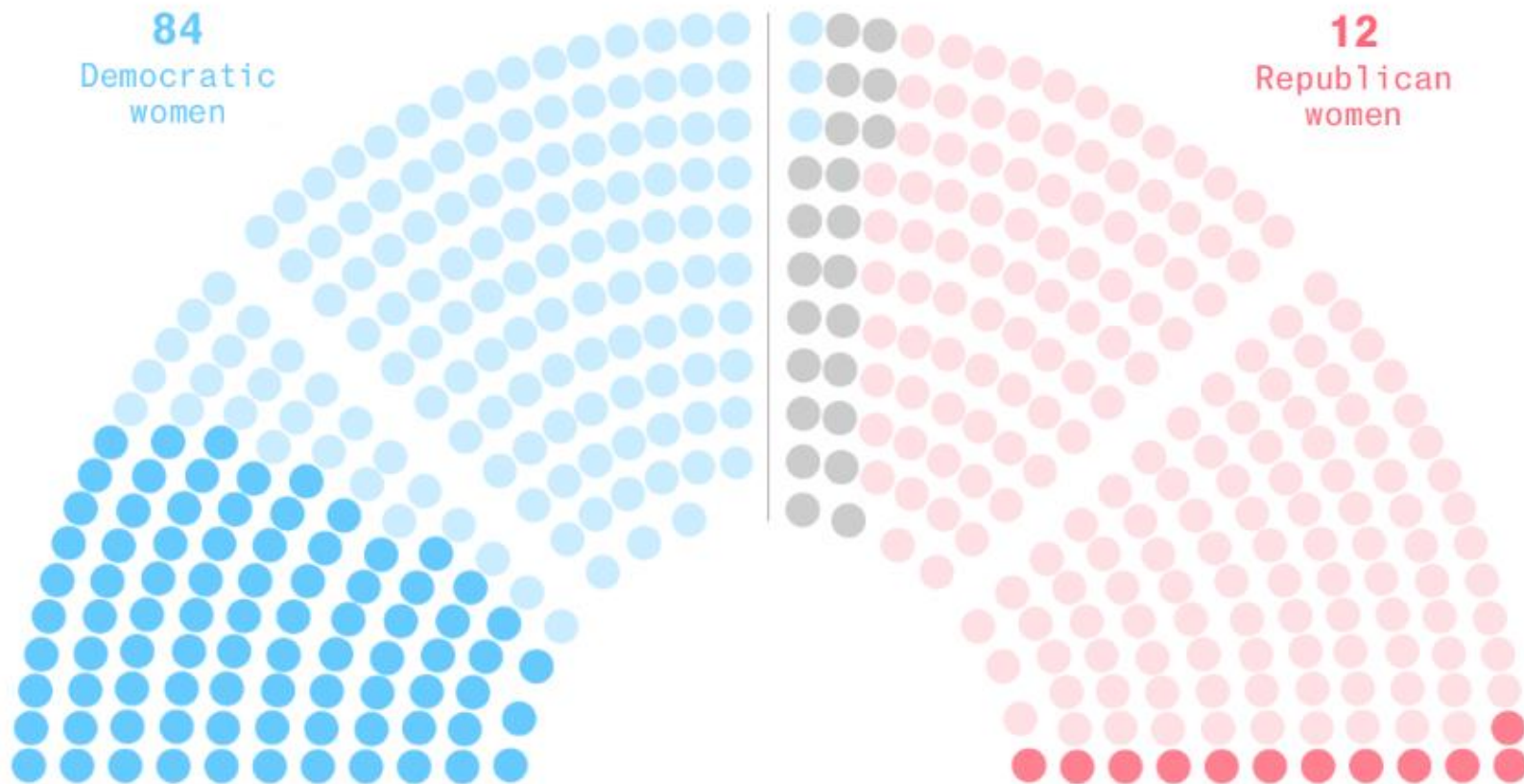

RACES AS OF 11:30 A.M. EST ON NOV. 7



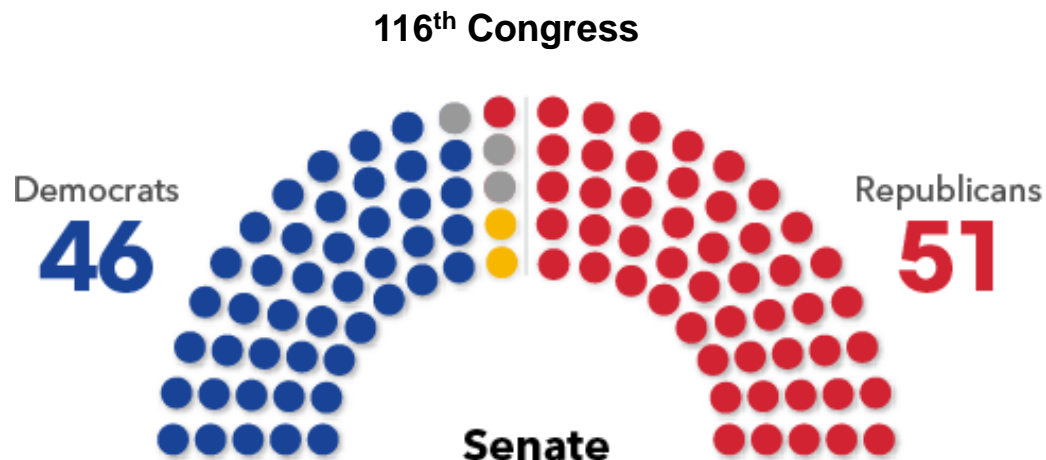
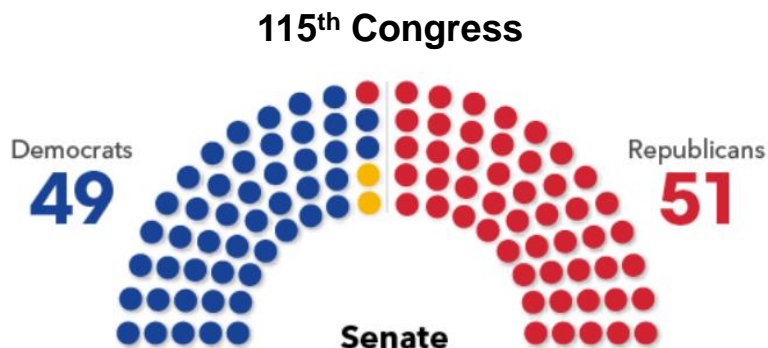

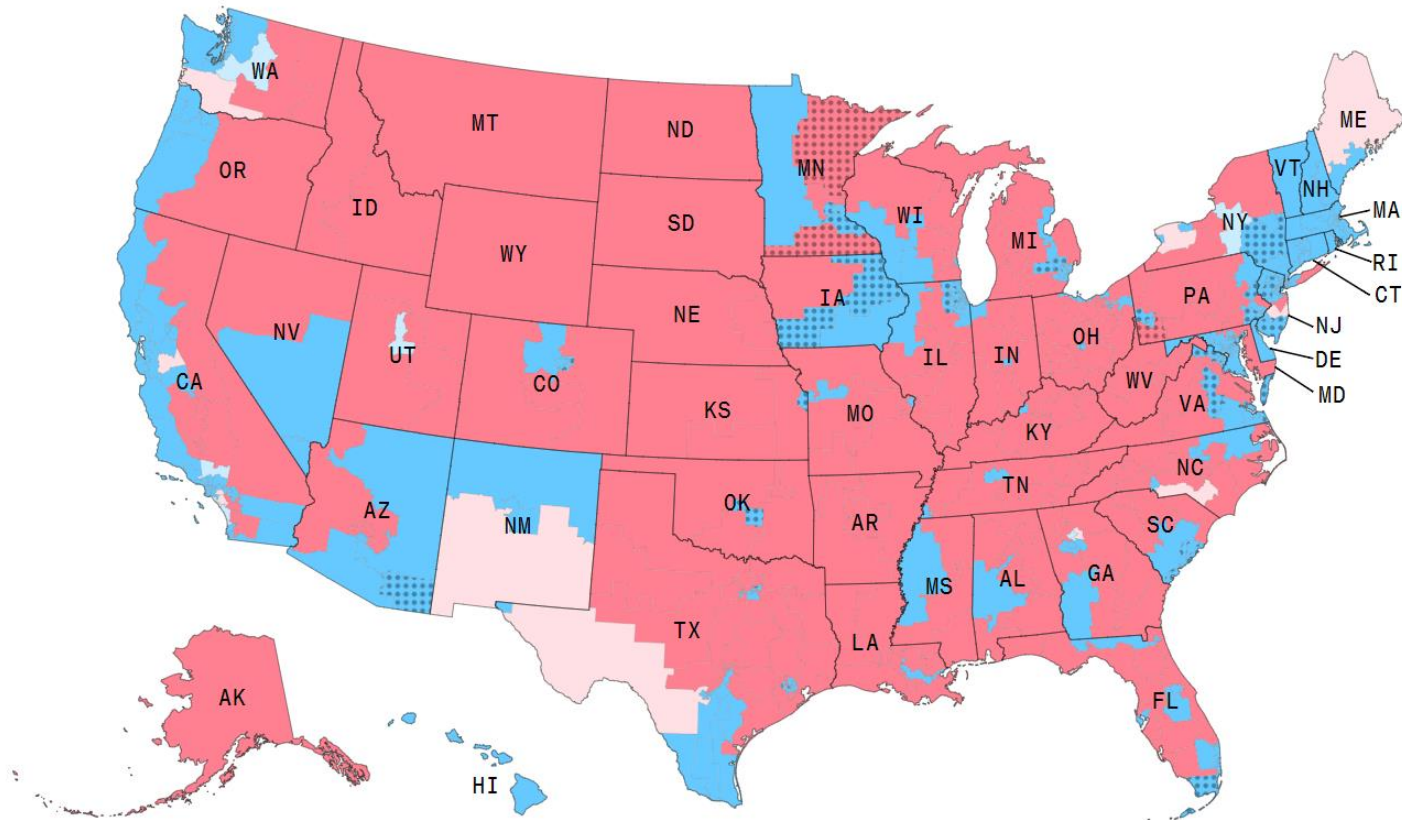

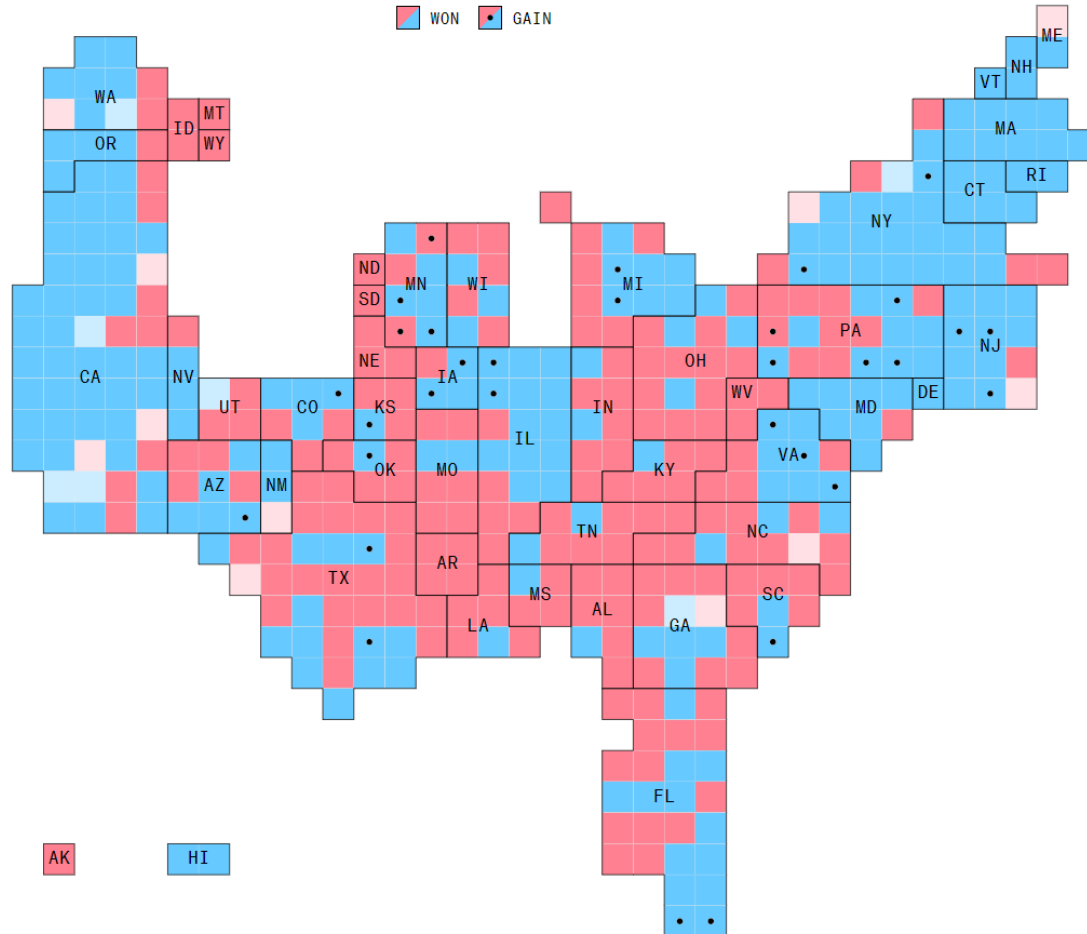

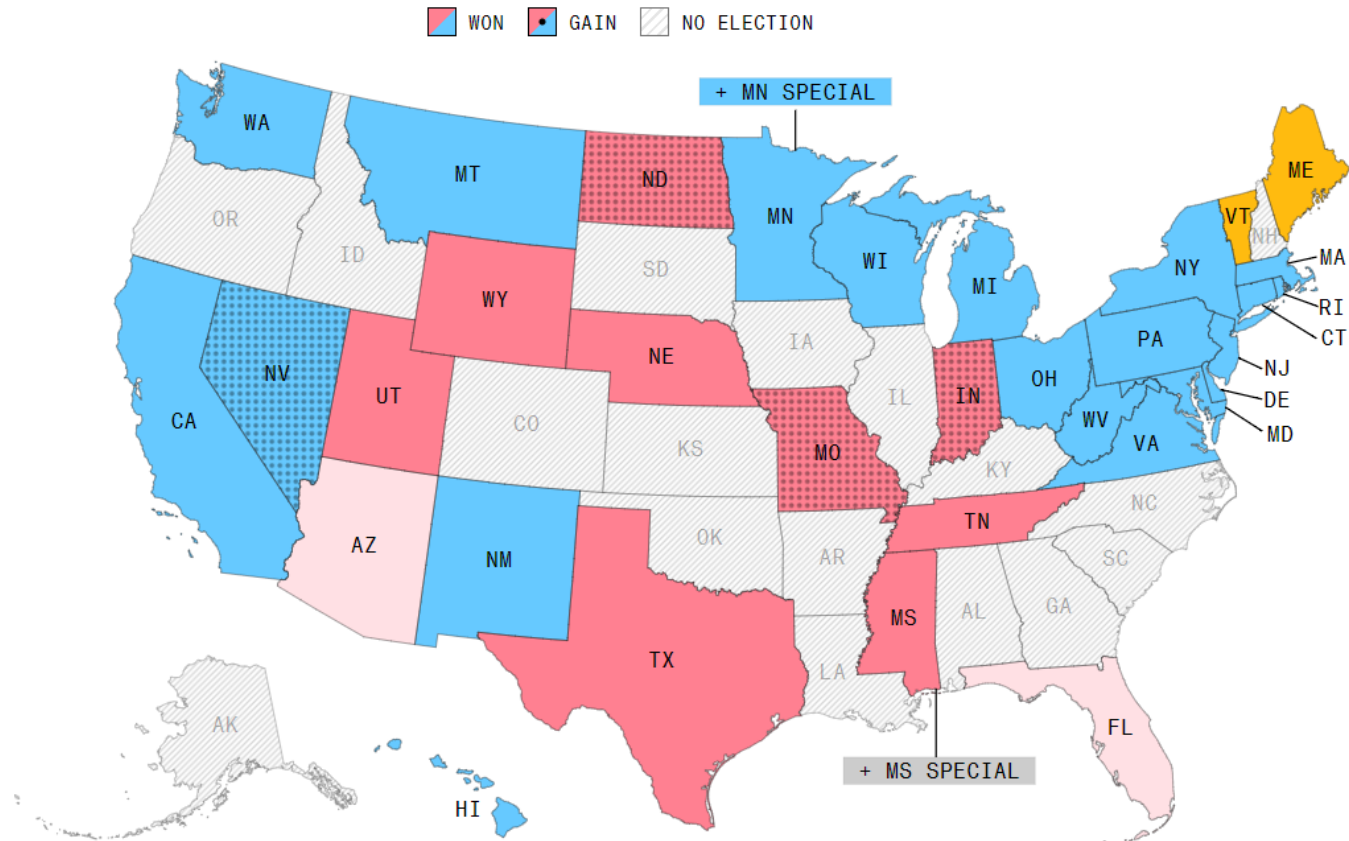

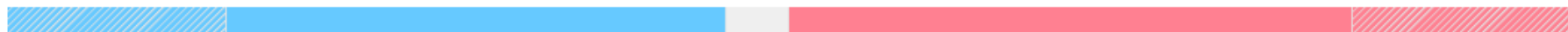

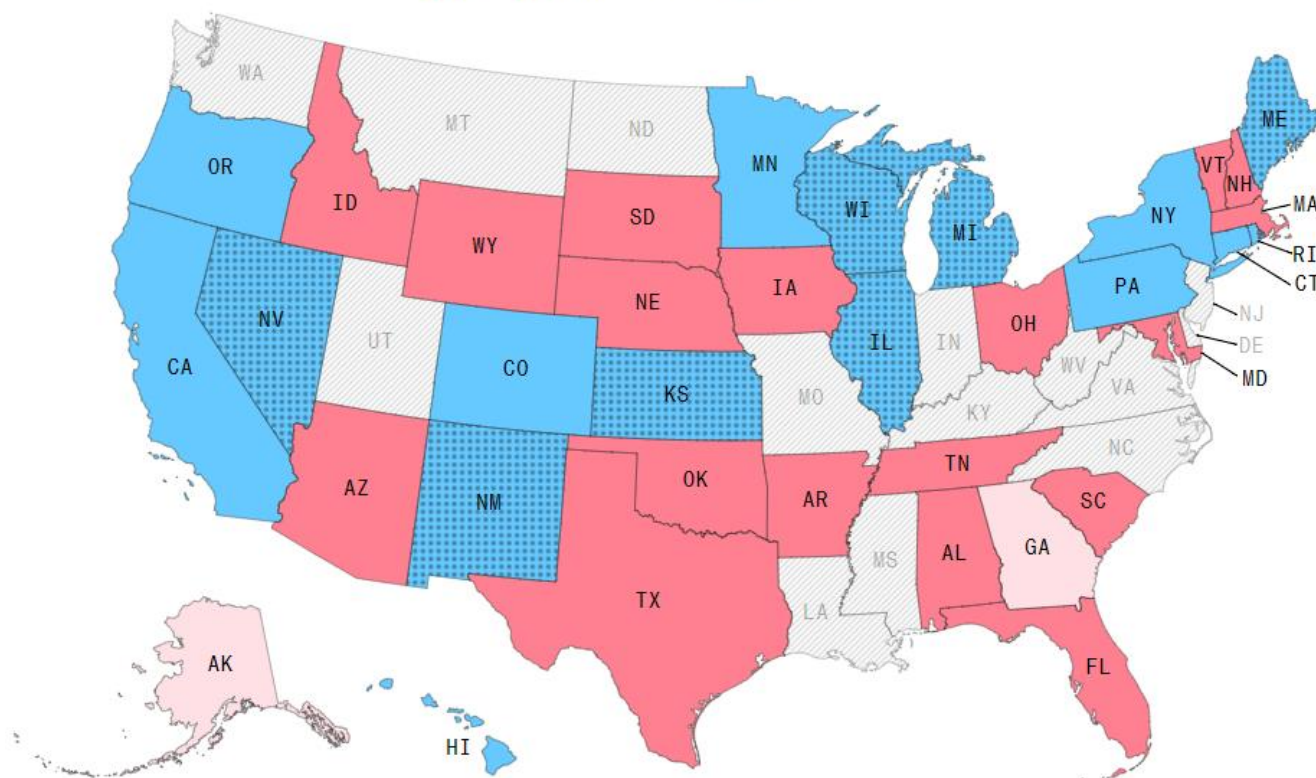
